

The Faculty of Theology of the University of St Michael's College, a Roman Catholic institution of higher education federated with the University of Toronto, seeks applications for the position of **Post-doctoral Fellow**. This 12-month position will begin on 1 September 2017 and may be renewable for an additional two years. This position is part of a SSHRC-funded project to study and critically edit a twelfth-century Latin Christian commentary on the Pentateuch. Reporting to the Principal Investigator, the successful candidate will participate in the transcription of the relevant manuscripts and collaborate with the international team of scholars on creating the critical edition and building the various apparatus. The post-doctoral fellow will also be responsible for some administrative duties for the overall project.

The successful candidate will possess, granted in the last five years, a PhD (or equivalent) either in medieval studies or in a single discipline with a medieval focus. (S)he will also have a fluent proficiency in medieval Latin, have some graduate training Latin paleography, and can demonstrate some familiarity with either text editing or diplomatics. It is expected that the successful candidate will have advanced research proficiency in medieval philosophy or theology of the twelfth and thirteenth centuries (demonstrated primarily by peer-reviewed publications). While the focus of this position is research, there may be opportunities to teach a course each year for additional remuneration.

Previous experience of critical text editing for publication would be an asset. Experience with the digital tools for manuscript studies and/or text editing would also be an asset, since one of the project's goal is to make transcriptions available through web-based digital tools and resources. The successful candidate should be able to carry out long-term assignments on an independent basis as well interface with co-editors through VOIP, such as Skype, to collate and edit texts at a distance. The project is likely to use the CTE application to create the print-based edition.
