SMC President's Column


I was at a meeting in Simcoe Hall the other day where a senior official of the University of Toronto congratulated me on the splendid appearance of the St. Michael's campus this summer. Later, as I walked beside the Brennan Hall rock garden with its display of different shapes and, and glanced toward the main quadrangle with Michael at its centre surrounded by a carpet of shaded greens, it was easy to appreciate the reasons for my friend's comment. Our campus, itself, is one of St. Michael's greatest assets.

However, this past July in the middle of our sesquicentennial anniversary, the College, far from being a quiet oasis, became a focus for many special activities associated with World Youth Day 2002 and the visit to Toronto of Pope John Paul II. The Coop played host to the Youth Day University Café with live themed entertainment from each of the six continents. Catechesis for pilgrims from Italy took place in St. Basil's Church. Portable toilets had to be installed in Elmsley Place and on Orientation Field. St. Michael's professors were heavily featured as the media reported and analyzed the largest public event ever held in Canada.

St. Michael's was an integral part of this impressive witnessing to our faith as it has been for every significant development in the ongoing life of the Church for a century and a half. And this, I think, helps point the way to an increasingly important public role the College will play in the early years of the new millennium.

The motto for our sesquicentennial is "Celebrating our Heritage, Building our Future." Having commented on the College's past and present in the last two issues of the Double Blue it is the second part of the motto that gives rise to the following thoughts.

It is clear that through its federation with the University of Toronto, St. Michael's will continue to provide and improve an already unequalled undergraduate educational experience for its students. Our other divisions – the Faculty of Theology, the Pontifical Institute of Mediaeval Studies and the Division of Continuing Education – will maintain and build on their outstanding records in advanced theological education, high scholarship and research and service to the broader community. Our institutional mandate can also be expected to address new needs in our society as they develop. The United Nations has identified Toronto as the



most multi-cultural city in a world of increasing interdependence. Following the tragedy of 9/11, last year's inaugural Furlong lecture and symposium on "Recent Changes in Relations between Catholics and Jews" will be followed by this October's symposium, partially sponsored by the Canadian Government on "Understanding Islam". Your College intends to lead the way in promoting understanding between major faith groups in our community.

In a post WorldCom and Enron age, St. Michael's, in partnership with the Conference Board in Canada, will continue to develop and expand its groundbreaking diploma programme in corporate social responsibility. Our sponsorship of the Canadian Catholic Bioethics Institute will place us at the centre of the public consideration and debate of the scientific and ethical questions that will increasingly come to identify our era.

These are just three examples of the many new ways in which St. Michael's seeks to serve the broader community in which we all live and act. Combined with our primary focus on teaching and scholarship I believe they are testimony to an institution facing the future with confidence and a renewed sense of purpose. In our anniversary year, as we honour our past, I also invite each of you to an active participation in shaping the St. Michael's future.
