2.0	Follow-up items from previous meetings First Aid Training There were not as many participants for the first aid training as preferred. We assigned providers to oversee first aid kits at all campus locations. First aid boxes were refilled by Cintas earlier in 2023 (refilled 2-3 year). AED batteries and pads have been replaced with the assistance of facilities and services. Our AEDs are compliant with regulations and won't have to be replaced for the next 3 years. Health and Safety Hazards in Residences Issue of human waste left in shower: the incidents stopped for a few weeks (after signs were posted and students warned. There was one incident that occurred after the warnings in which the student floor was issued a fine. Since this and the end of school year, there have been no other incidents reported.		15 min

	Health and safety Policies All Health and Safety related policies have been reviewed and re-signed by Bursar. The policies are posted online and, on the Health and Safety Board in Elmsley Hall. It was agreed that first aid kit and responder information page to be posted at all campus locations/buildings.		
3.0	USMC's Blue Communities Pledge The University of St. Michael's College and Regis College will become a "Blue Communities" pledging to help protect the planet's water and promote the human rights to water and sanitation. Both Regis and St. Mike's have joined the Sisters of St. Joseph to adopt a seven commitment "Blue Community Pledge". Sustainability is part of one of the 3 pillars of USMC's strategic plan. Banning the sale of boxed/bottled water on campus encourages the availability of clean water. The University is adding more water reusable bottle refill stations (information to be circulated regarding locations). We want to educate the community such as incorporating this initiative in our courses. The water quality is checked regularly which includes water testing and treatment. 2.0	 Re-opening, Survey/COVID-19 Updates & Fall Planning The fall reopening feedback from the recent survey is generally positive with employees looking forward to working on campus again. Highlights include: 70% wish for social distancing to continue 80% would like access to PPE 61% strongly agree to having a remote part of the job. Most responded Strongly Agree to: "I feel confident that I would receive support from coworkers and my manager if I needed it." The university is running out of office space, desk sharing couple help alleviate this. Feeling a sense of community is an important topic that staff are looking forward to. Flexibility is a top response as a benefit of WFH. Staff appreciate that we consult with them on their accommodation needs. The University is monitoring the status of seventh wave with respect to fall planning. If a shift to close 		20 min

	is needed, this can be done quickly. USMC is following UofT and Toronto Health guidelines. Currently, there is a feeling of lack of community as campus feels empty. Preference for on campus work and meetings as in-person conversations can lead to spontaneous ideas/innovation. The Bursar is to meet with the reopening committee to finalize fall reopening planning. Question for committee: how can USMCS have more of a community presence but also maintain strong covid health and safety protocols? The committee is developing an alternative work arrangement guideline. Taking a look and adapting UofT's guidelines. An alternative working arrangement guideline is in the drafting stage. PAG & USW to review before finalizing. The University is moving forward to a more robust reopening and would like to see more staff on campus in the fall. Support for on-campus work should be positive given that all employees are vaccinated and masking and distancing protocols are still in place. Offices must look at operation requirements when determining AWA scheduling and approvals. St. Mike's will continue to provide masks to staff, if requested. N95s can be provided if in stock. Currently, there is no provincial or legal requirement to mask. Therefore, mandating is not possible. Staff are encouraged and may choose to continue wearing masks or ask others to wear it if in small spaces (eg. meeting in a small office). There are options to hold meetings or events outdoors as much as possible. More news regarding reopening survey stats will be shared in the newsletter.		45

	days since September 2022. The issue was being handled by Dean's office and has escalated to HR and JHSC. Signs and messages have been posted in the Sorbara G shower area to remind students of the consequences if this behaviour continues. USMC has undertaken a much more aggressive response over March/April regarding this issue. A memo was sent out to the students advising that if the incidents do not stop, the students on the floor may be fined, expelled, or banned from living at UofT residences. HR has had meetings with housekeeping to reassure staff that the University is doing everything to put a stop to this concerning behaviour.
